## **One-Stop Early Voting**

One-Stop Early Voting is available for those who are registered in Guilford County to vote at the Board of Elections offices (301 W. Market St., Greensboro & 505 E. Green Dr., High Point) or at any of the designated satellite sites across the county, starting on the third Thursday prior to an election and ending at 1 p.m. on the Saturday before the election. (§ G.S. 163-227.2)

## **How Does It Work? *Easy As 1-2-3***

1. Go to one of the designated early voting sites
2. Check-in at the registration table (State your full name and address)
3. Cast your ballot

***It's Just Like Voting on Election Day!***

## **What To Expect During Early Voting**

- Provisional Voting is allowed at Early Voting Sites
- You are only required to provide identification if this is the first election you are voting in, in Guilford County

## **Services For Persons With Disabilities**

**All early voting sites are handicap accessible**

**All voters who request assistance are entitled to voter assistance**

### **Who May Assist a Voter?**

- Near relatives- spouse, parent, child, sibling, grandparent, grandchild, in-law, stepparent and stepchild
- Other relatives may assist the voter *ONLY IF* the voter is blind, disabled or illiterate
- Poll workers may assist any voter

### **Who May NOT Assist Voters?**

- Voter's employer
- Agent of the voter's employer
- Officer or agent of the voter's union
- Anyone by telephone

## **Curbside Voting**

If you are unable to enter the voting place because of age or physical disability, you will be allowed to vote either in your vehicle or immediately outside the voting place. Have someone enter the voting place and inform an early voting official of your desire to vote in this manner.



## **Top 5 Reasons for Voting Early**

**CONVENIENCE, CONVENIENCE!!!**

1. ***Easy As 1-2-3***
2. You can vote at any of the early voting sites in Guilford County
3. You can vote anytime during the two week early voting period before Election Day
4. You can vote at any of the early voting sites even if you've moved
5. A voter does not have to provide an excuse or reason for voting early
